SYNOPSIS

Áyax Grandi, an architect from the city of Rosario, Argentina decided at the age of 48 to become Canela. This film takes us through Canela's journey as she struggles between being true to herself and conforming to societal norms. Fueled by this inner conflict, Canela embarks on a profound quest for self-discovery, seeking guidance from healthcare professionals, confiding in her children, and reconnecting with old friends. Along this path, Canela stumbles upon a surprising revelation about her desires.

DIRECTORS' STATEMENT

The documentary, a transformation.

I began the journey of making my first documentary six years ago: it was a naive start. I came from fiction, from closed scripts, from the established structure, and from the somewhat deceitful relief that preconceived ideas give you.

The challenges inherent to the documentary genre, such as knowing how to find the necessary time for the protagonist to reveal themselves and thus assert themselve in the story; being receptive to genuine moments by creating the appropriate circumstances for situations to emerge; thinking about how to weave those moments; subordinating oneself to the availability of the protagonist within the framework of their life; dealing with the complexity of working with roving technical teams: everything was much more difficult than expected.

In the long creative process that involved traversing artistic residencies and encountering other perspectives allowed me to become aware of the narrative. I received the most beautiful compliment when a tutor told me that she was moved by the love in my look at the protagonist. At that moment, I understood that fascination had turned into friendship, and that I was filming a beloved woman. A transgender woman, a woman with fears, with worries, but above all with questions about feeling like a woman. Nothing was foreign to me; in one way or another, I had felt similar things. We both accompanied each other on our journeys. She, answered questions through unexpected encounters that turned into a beautiful story; and I, the crazy, long, and strange process of making the film. This documentary, which I adore as much as its protagonist, is an experience that has profoundly transformed me as a filmmaker and also a person.
